Daisy is the mascot for Frontier Animal Society's upcoming Annual Dog Walk, but she is also a reminder of why fundraisers like this matter.

Daisy was surrendered into our care in mid-April. Adjusting to the shelter environment was challenging for her. More than anything, Daisy needs the stability, reassurance, and sense of security that come with having a home of her own.

Although Daisy received some inquiries, somehow she was never quite the right fit. Then, three weeks ago, it finally seemed that her luck was about to change. A couple came to meet her and fell in love. They understood her energy and her insecurities and were excited to welcome her into their home. Plans were made to bring her home the following week, after what we hoped would be a routine visit to our veterinarian.

Sadly, that visit brought unexpected news. Daisy was diagnosed with megaesophagus, a condition that affects her ability to move food normally to her stomach. Further testing is needed to determine whether there is an underlying cause that can be treated.

Faced with a medical condition they had not anticipated, Daisy's prospective adopters made the difficult decision not to proceed. Instead of heading to her new home, Daisy remains with us while we determine what comes next.

We know that life in the shelter has been hard on Daisy. Just when we thought she was finally going to have the security and stability of a home of her own, she is facing another period of uncertainty.

The next phase of Daisy's diagnostics will cost close to \$1,000, and she will likely need to see a specialist. We will do what we can and make decisions based on Daisy's needs, not on cost. She is just a year old, and we hope to identify the cause, find a treatment that will help, and give her another chance at the happy ending that seemed so close.
